· INVESTIGATION, REVIEW, AND RESOLUTION

- You may make a report with the University, the police, or both entities. The University, once notified of a complaint, will investigate your complaint in a prompt, thorough, and impartial manner while offering support services for any party involved.
- You may choose to utilize support services at the time you report or at any point in the future. Even if you choose not to pursue a formal complaint, University staff will work with you to make sure you receive support and services as needed and/or requested.
- After an investigation, matters of sexual misconduct between students are resolved by the Title IX Coordinator for Sexual Misconduct. Possible sanctions for students found responsible for sexual misconduct include restriction of access, University probation, suspension, or expulsion.



- Student on student complaints are resolved using the Office of Community Life Standards' student conduct process. Where the accused party is an employee, the employee and faculty processeswill be utilized.
- All complaints are resolved using the 'preponderance of the evidence' standard, meaning 'is inore likely than not' that an incident occurred. The University process is separate from a legalprocess.
- The Dean of Students Office (618.664.6831) can assist with academic and housing accomodations, referrals to student health/counseling/ministry as well as student conduct matters.
