

For a MAP eligible traditional student, the initial Financial Aid Notice assumes the student will be enrolled for a minimum of 15 credit hours each semester. Your MAP amount may be lower depending on your Student Aid Index (SAI).

If the student enrolls in fewer than 15 credit hours any semester, the MAP award will be reduced proportionately. For example, if a student takes 14 hours in the Fall, he/she will receive a Fall MAP Grant of \$3,763 of the maximum \$4,032 (Refer to the MAP Grant Level chart below for more information.)

Interterm hours will count as enrolled hours for the Spring semester for the purposes of MAP Grant eligibility. This means that a student taking a three-credit Interterm course and 12 credits in the Spring will meet the 15-hour enrollment requirement to receive the full MAP Grant. Students must take all 15 credits for the Fall semester to receive the full MAP Grant.

The following statement is an ISAC required disclosure:

**You may be eligible for a State of Illinois MAP grant.**

Because you completed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid, you are also considered for financial aid from the State of Illinois. You may qualify for a **State of Illinois MAP grant**—financial aid from the State of Illinois that is based on financial need and **does not have to be repaid**. If you are eligible:

- Your financial aid offer from the school includes an estimated amount listed as **IL MAP (estimated)**.
- The amount listed is an **estimate**. The final amount may change depending on how much funding the state provides this year, as well as the number of hours you’re enrolled and your other sources of aid.
- MAP grant awards may be received for up to about 4½ years of full-time college.
